SUBJECT: PRESENTATION: PCTPA 2036 REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLAN (RTP) / SACOG METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION PLAN (MTP) DEVELOPMENT PROCESS

BACKGROUND
As the state designated Regional Transportation Planning Agency (RTPA) for Placer County, PCTPA is required to prepare and adopt a Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) every five years. The last RTP was adopted in September 2010. The RTP is a long-range transportation funding plan that identifies future transportation improvements, associated cost, and timing of implementation. Each RTP is guided by a regional set of goals, objectives, and policies to maintain the transportation infrastructure and enhance mobility over the 20-year life of the plan.

The Placer County RTP is integrated into the broader regional planning context of the Sacramento Area Council of Governments' (SACOG) Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP), per our Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). SACOG is the state designated RTPA for Sacramento, Sutter, Yolo, and Yuba counties and is also the federally designated Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for the six county region including Placer and El Dorado. As an RTPA and MPO, SACOG updates the MTP every four years to satisfy their federal planning responsibilities for the six-county region and state requirement to develop a Sustainable Communities Strategy (SCS) pursuant to Senate Bill 375.

DISCUSSION
