**PLACER COUNTY TRANSIT AGENCIES ANNOUNCE  
LAUNCH OF SUMMER YOUTH BUS PASS**  
*\$10 pass is good for unlimited rides*

AUBURN, CA – Placer County Transportation Planning Agency (PCTPA) along with Placer County transit providers (which includes Auburn Transit, Lincoln Transit, Roseville Transit and Placer County Transit) are proud to announce the launch of the 2005 Summer Youth Pass.

Beginning May 1, this bus pass will be available to Placer County students five to 18 years of age. The 2005 Summer Youth Pass will only cost \$10 and is good for unlimited rides on all the transit providers between June 1 and August 31, 2005. Popular regional destinations for youth transit riders include local pools, theaters, bowling alleys and summer job locations. Transit providers also serve Golfland SunSplash and Westfield Shoppingtown Galleria at Roseville.

“The 2005 Summer Youth Pass will help students get to everything from outdoor recreation spots to their summer jobs,” said PCTPA Executive Director Celia McAdam. “Not only is it convenient, it will help Placer County students learn the value of alternative transportation while having a safe and fun-filled summer vacation.”
