

Regional Transportation and Air Quality Mitigation Fee

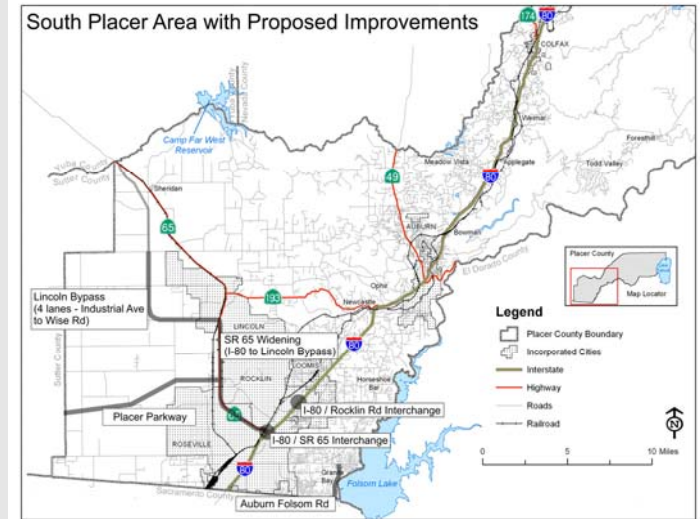
Building priority transportation projects in South Placer County

Overview

Fees on new development provide funding for critical regional transportation facilities in South Placer County (west of Auburn).

Key Benefits

- **Leverage**
Projects have attracted over \$310 million in federal and state discretionary funding so far
- **Local Control**
Project and funding priorities are all determined and administered locally
- **Flexibility**
SPRTA funds have been able to fill gaps and keep projects moving when federal and state dollars lag
- **Equity**
All new development in the South Placer area contributes their fair share to the regional projects, including state highways.

Fees and Districts

The area is divided into 10 fee districts, with fees calculated on a nexus-basis via the South Placer traffic model. Fees are assessed on all development, including residential, commercial, and industrial.

Fee Range

Current fees range from \$634 to \$2038 per development unit equivalent (DUE).

Membership and Governance

SPRTA is a Joint Powers Authority (JPA) formed by the Cities of Lincoln, Rocklin, and Roseville, and the County of Placer, and is administered by the Placer County Transportation Planning Agency (PCTPA). Each member jurisdiction appoints one Councilmember/Supervisor to serve on the SPRTA Board of Directors. Meetings are regularly scheduled on the 4th Wednesday of each month at 10:45 am at the Placer County Board of Supervisors Chambers in Auburn.

Voting Requirements

Administrative actions require 3 of 4 votes. Changes to the fee program or allocations of fees require unanimous vote of all 4 members.
