
Presentation: Sacramento-Reno Rail Study – First/Last Mile Analysis and Public Interest Survey

Background



- PCTPA prepared grant application to evaluate Capitol Corridor service extension to Reno
- Caltrans DRMT decided to fund and lead study
- DRMT study will focus on service, operations, and infrastructure analyses





The *Reno Extension Study* is focused on the UP- Roseville Subdivision between Sacramento and Reno. Technical work will be focused across service, operations, and infrastructure analyses focused on empowering decision making toward implementing service to Reno.

- UP freight service
- California Zephyr
- Connecting services
- Operations/Infrastructure Considerations
 - Stations
 - Line capacity
 - Equipment utilization
 - Storage needs





Funding Partners



- Seven funding partners had committed match funds to the grant application
- All agencies kept their match intact in order to fund study on:
 - First/last mile connections
 - Public interest survey
 - Expanded outreach
- PCTPA led; integrated into Caltrans study



What is included in First/Last Mile?










- While this list is not exhaustive, includes:

 - Ride-hailing (Uber, Lyft, taxi)
 - Micro transit (on-demand)
 - Resort/recreation shuttles
 - Bike/scooter share
 - Bicycle/pedestrian access
 - Transportation DemandManagement




First/Last Mile Connections



- Focus on seven stations in Placer,
 Nevada, and Washoe counties
- Examine existing transit, rideshare, microtransit, bike/ped access, shuttles, etc.
- High level considerations on new or improved services/access




Public Interest Survey



- Received over 5,800 responses!
- Survey had wide reach: 21 states; 49
 of 58 CA counties; 6 of 17 NV
 counties
- Placer, Nevada, Sacramento,
 Washoe, and San Francisco counties
 had the most responses
- Truckee had most responses of any one city/town



Public Interest Survey



- Recreation most common reason for travel; most would avoid traffic and use for comfort and scenery
- Willingness to ride with winter equipment (skis, etc)
- 83% would try the Reno rail service
- Only 28% would drive alone or be picked up from destination most use other modes

Public Interest Survey



- Active modes: most favorable to physical improvements
- Transit: Microtransit and Resort Shuttles most popular
- Vehicles: No strong negative opinions, most liked ridesharing incentives

- Sacramento region favors comfort/scenery; Bay Area & Mountain Communities favor avoiding traffic
- Sacramento & Bay Area mostly recreational; Mountain Communities for personal/visiting family & friends
- Mountain Communities &
 Sacramento most likely to use service over Bay Area

- Considerations in two sections:
 - Considerations for all stations
 - Considerations for specific stations

Considerations - All Stations





- Consider Transportation Network Company (TNC) incentive program
- Offer a discounted ticket for first time riders
- Wayfinding maps of surrounding area
- Install electric vehicle charging stations in the park and ride lot
- Map of surrounding transit services and schedules

Considerations - Specific Stations



- Bicycle facilities/parking and crosswalks
- Signs promoting app-based service (microtransit) services
- Circular shuttles in downtown areas
- Shuttles to ski resorts and/or casinos
- Scooter or bike share pilots
- Fixed transit routing













Conclusions & Next Steps

- Considerations meant as a guide for implementing agencies
- Will inform Caltrans DRMT study on the feasibility of Reno Rail Extension
- May evolve over time as Reno Rail Extension planning takes shape
- PCPTA's Draft Report out for comment with PDT. Caltrans expected to release PSR by 3/3/23
